

# Christchurch Samoan language group: Feedback Summary

#### Are the proposed areas important?

- Feedback was almost entirely focused on bilingual education and a strong support for bilingual provision. A number of comments also supportive of addressing racism.
- Some felt like Samoan language exams set by NZQA should be better and raised issue of Pacific teachers qualifications not being recognised

- Specific focus on literacy and numeracy
- Focus on ECE for bilingual
- Extend already successful programmes (e.g. Reading together is too short)
- Definition of success needs to be more specific

- What is happening in schools to address racism?
- What tools will be used to encourage Pacific students to go down the path of teaching? Parents feel like there is not enough information or if there is, it is not reaching parents

- Yes areas are considered important by Tongan language group
- Specific mentions of needing more
   Tongan teachers qualified to teach the
   Tongan language
- Desire to see more home-based schooling opportunities for Tongan families to teach Tongan culture and language
- Need more education opportunities and relationships with parents so they feel like they are part of the education system

- Need Ministry of Education to provide facilitators to help Tongan parents, as a navigator type role
- Need better connections between Primary and Secondary school
- Need a way to better understand what the standards are in education and how to pass
- More funding for the Tongan language to be taught every day of the week.
   Sometimes taught just once a week
- Meaningful connection between school and work
- NCEA standards that are relevant to Pacific students and can help them support their families
- We need to develop closer relationships between Health support services and vulnerable learners and families
- Support and guidance for Tongan language to be home language for students
